Duke of Edinburgh Award

If your aim is to gain this award with Explorers Scouts or with your school then you should also look at the awards within the Explorers Scout section such as the Platinum, Diamond or the Queens Scout Award.



These awards are almost gained once you have done the Duke of Edinburgh award however the missing parts can easily be done with your section through their training award scheme.

However to get any of these awards including the Young Leaders award you need to be invested into our section.

So how do I get invested?

As you have completed the Module A with the Explorers Scouts at their HQ then it's only fair we come to you for the investiture. So you will need to speak with your section leader and ask when it is good for them for this to take place. As soon as they decide ask them to give Scot Munday the Explorers Scout Commissioner to arrange a time to come down to perform the investiture

How much will it cost?

If you have not been invested as an Explorers Scout you will need to have a necker so that you can be invested. These can be obtained from Rawcliffes in town and the cost about £5. That is all you will need to pay, just like any other Explorers Scout

Do I get anything else?

As part of the investiture you will receive an Explorers Scout name tape and the Young Leaders badge!



Can I not wear my Groups necker?

Of course you can! You are a member of your group and the Explorers Scout section so you can wear both, just like all the international Scouters do!!

Do I need to come to any more Young Leaders meetings?

Well of course you do as this is your section and the Young Leaders meetings are your time to mix with like minded Explorers. It is also your chance to find out what Explorers Scout activities are coming up just in case you fancy a pop!
